What is Fuel Poverty?


Definition:

"A household is in fuel poverty if, in order to maintain a satisfactory level of heating throughout the home, the occupants would have to spend more than **10%** of their income on all household fuel use."




Fuel Poverty and older households

- **Pre-payment meters and accessibility issues:** Can often face broader difficulties vending for fuels particularly in gas pre-payment meters who can only vend if they physically go to a shop with a PayPoint and top up to a maximum of £49.00.
- **Digital Exclusion:** Households with limited access to the internet face an energy cost premium because they are not able to access the best deals or they are missing out on programmes that are only accessible to those that are online.
- **Higher reluctance to accept new technologies:** Older households are often slower to transition to new heating technologies as these often require a significant behavioural change aspect. This can expose households to higher energy costs.



Excess Winter Deaths

In 2019/20, 60.0% of the estimated excess winter deaths involved people aged 75 and over.



Cold Homes and Health

- EWDs are almost three times higher in the coldest quarter of housing than in the warmest quarter.
- We know that deaths from cardiovascular diseases are directly linked to exposure to excessively low indoor temperatures for long periods of time.
- There is also increasing evidence to show that Children living in cold homes are more than twice as likely to suffer from a variety of respiratory problems than children living in warm homes.
- Exposure to cold can increases the level of minor illnesses such as colds and flu and exacerbates existing conditions such as arthritis and rheumatisms.

Figures are likely higher due to the impacts of Covid-19 and wholesale energy price rises.



Methodology

- Polling was carried out by Belfast based polling and market research company LucidTalk.
- The Poll presented **10 questions** for respondents designed to capture information on the impact of rising energy prices and the ongoing cost of living crisis for households in NI.
- The project was carried out online for a period of **4 days from 7th to 10th June 2022**.
- The project targeted the established Northern Ireland (NI) LucidTalk online Opinion Panel (14,000+ members) which is balanced by gender, age group, area of residence, and community background, in order to be demographically representative of Northern Ireland.
- 2,527 full responses were received, and a data auditing process was carried out to ensure all completed poll-surveys were genuine 'one-person, one-vote' responses. This resulted in 2,468 responses being considered in terms of the final base dataset results.




• In excess of 800 unedited qualitative comments were also received.

POLL QUESTION 1: What proportion of your household income do you spend on heating (oil or gas) and electricity?







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




