



Seeds for Bees Wildflower Planting Instructions

	<p>Each person will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 composite pots • 2 coir compost discs • a pinch of wildflower seeds per pot

<p>Step One: Preparing the coir disc to turn into compost</p>	<p>You will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 coir discs • 100-130ml lukewarm water per disc • A container (eg tub, bowl, basin) to hold the water and coir disc as it expands. • *Be careful not to over-wet.
	

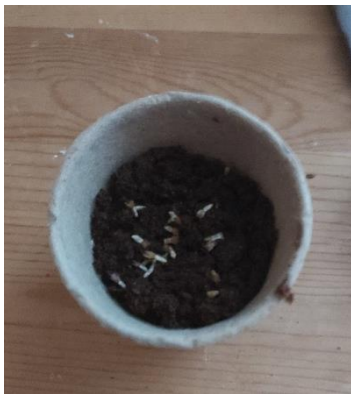
<p>Step Two – add water to disc</p>	<p>Watch it expand</p>	<p>Now you have compost!</p>
		

Step Three - Potting up



Using a spoon or small scoop, fill your composite pot two thirds of the way up.

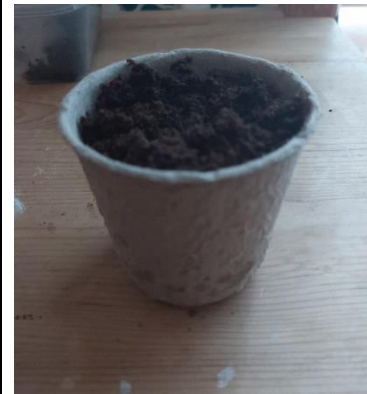
Step Four - Sprinkle Wildflower Seeds



Sprinkle a small pinch of wildflower seeds on top of the compost.



Once the seeds have been added, top up with compost



Watch and Water!

Now all you need to do is watch, water and wait for them to grow. Try to place them somewhere with lots of sunlight like a kitchen windowsill.

Make sure to water them a little whenever the compost feels dry.

These wildflowers will do well outdoors in our climate, but you may wish to watch them initially indoors. Once they're sprouting a centimetre or two, pop them outside somewhere sheltered and sunny. Again, keep them well watered.

The pots supplied are made from of a compostible material which will naturally break down if planted in the ground. You could place them into window boxes or flowerpots if you don't have space to plant them in a flower bed or somewhere similar. You may also spot an unloved patch of public ground somewhere nearby you think the bees would love and decide to dig your pot in there!
